### A WORD FROM YOUR ORGANIST-CHOIRMASTER

Music – what's in a title?

The titles for the opening and closing are always included in the worship bulletin. Music written in various periods use titles in specific ways. Music from the Baroque (1600-1750) often used dance rhythms, so titles such as Gigue, (or Jig), Minuet, Gavotte, etc. relate to the time signature, or pulse of the music. Tempo terms are also used, such as Allegro (fast), Largo (slow) and others in between. Classical period (1750-1820) is more about form – think of the stately, well-spaced columns and proportions of classical architecture. Sonata, Rondo, Scherzo all relate to what is going to happen to the structure in a composition. The Romantic period (begins late 18<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> century) features more descriptive titles such as Dawn Hymn, Carillon as well as titles reflecting large forms such as Symphony or Concerto. With the rise of Nationalism during this time, titles and musical terms were no longer universally in Italian. German, French and even English (!) are used.

All terms/titles are used today, and give the listener a clue as to the style or sounds to be expected. For example: Trumpet Tune.

If you every have any questions, please ask!

...And for those who like numbers: Having just finished Easter and some very "lively" organ music. The Widor *Toccata*, from his 5<sup>th</sup> Symphony, played at the three Easter services has 126 notes in the first measure alone! There are 61 measures. You can do the math. To balance out this explosion of notes, the Sunday after Easter's Voluntary: *Cantabile* extracted from the Organ Symphony of Saint-Saëns, has only 1 note – and that measure lasts a longer time than measure 1 in the Widor Toccata.

By the way, *Cantabile* means songlike, and a *Toccata* means to touch, or a "finger-piece" with lots of fast moving notes.
