# A Love Letter to St. Mary's



Pilgrims from all over come to visit St. Mary's because they have heard of the Martyrs of Memphis or the courageous actions of Dean Bill Dimmick in the 1960's. Others arrive on the Cathedral doorstep because they feel mysteriously drawn to its beauty. Many unsheltered and very poor also come seeking safety, food and drink, financial assistance as well as friendship and community. St. Mary's is so exciting on Sunday but every day of the week is filled with excitement.

Again, thanks for the blessing to be a part of your faith community. Together we are making our selves, family, and Memphis so much better. I love and adore you all. God is so very good for putting us together. I am excited about what is forthcoming. I give the future a Andv+
