



A Stroll for the Soul

Fat Tuesday is February 12. Many will be eating pancakes this night. At St. Mary's, we are ordering up chicken and waffles and Dixieland jazz band. Ash Wednesday is the next day – a day of prayer, ritual, ashes, reflection, confession and an invitation to change something in life that will make us better. God is always moving to improve and enhance our lives. Ash Wednesday and the 40 day observance of Lent is trying to tap into transformation that God is about in us – setting us free from anything that is not of Christ in us.

According to a recent survey from Church Housing, over 20 per cent of adults in the United States are planning to observe the season of Lent, although nearly one in three of them don't know what to 'give up' or 'take up.' The following percentages were recorded in answer to the question: **"Which, if any, of the following describe what you are planning to do for Lent this year?":**

- Will do something but don't know what yet (32% of those observing Lent)
- Try to do more positive/kindly acts (21%)
- Give up chocolate or other treats (17%)
- Stop shopping for non-essential items (17%)
- Give money to charity (10%)
- Take up doing something spiritual like praying, reading the Bible (9%)
- Stop swearing (9%)
- Give up alcohol (8%)
- Cut back on social media/gaming (7%)
- Volunteer for a charity (7%)
- Stop smoking (6%)
- Something else (4%)

These are some great disciplines to ponder for the 40 day fast. I hope you will consider also a *daily 30 minute stroll for your soul*. My good friend and spiritual director, Linda Douty, shared this title with me. I love the hope of all of St. Mary's being active for 30 minutes a day during this season– walking around the block, swimming laps in a pool, strutting up and down the hall. Thirty minutes a day strolling for your soul in prayer and thoughtfulness.

Please look for the daily Lenten emails you will receive from the St. Mary's clergy. Selection of Holy Scripture to pray on, questions to ponder, spiritual writings to reflect upon – these could be useful as you walk and exercise your beautiful body which is the palace Christ choose to dwell in.

Also, come with us as we "Walk in Memphis" on the Wednesday nights in Lent.

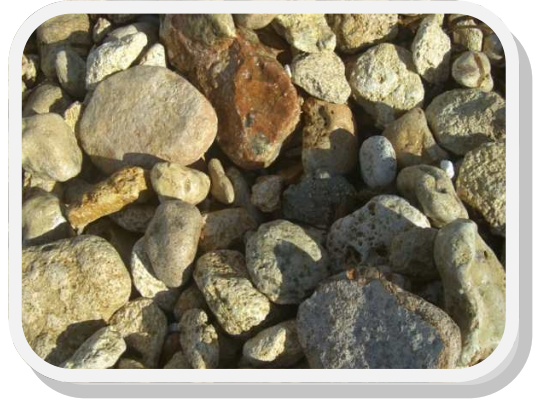

The Canon's Corner

With Ash Wednesday on the 13th of this month, we begin a thought-full time of intentionality as we move into Lent and its forty (ish) days. For some, it is a time of slowing down – if even for just a few minutes each day. For others, it's a time of taking on a particular practice that connects them to the divine, and maybe that practice is giving something up or taking something on. Whatever it is, Lent is about “de-cluttering”, de-cluttering the stuff and diversions in our lives that keep us occupied but not fed. Because the purpose of Lent is about expanding our hearts.



As a part of this expanding, I invite you to a special practice this season. Beginning the first Sunday in Lent, you will see that the baptismal font is filled with rocks. This is a practice we have done in the past. But this year, you are invited to *select a rock* and hold onto it for the week. Then *bring it back the next Sunday* and choose another rock.

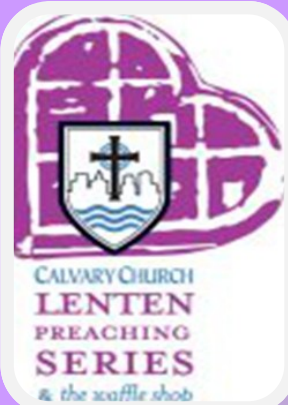
There's something solid in a rock. You can hold onto it. You can roll it around and trace over its edges. Keep it in your pocket or purse and touch it every now and then. If there's a certain prayer or person who has been on your mind or in your heart, hold your rock as you think of about these things or persons.

When you return the rock after your week of praying with and carrying it, someone else will carry your rock and “hold” your prayer. Trust that your rock (and prayer) will be carried throughout the week by another in the community. And that likewise, you will do the same and hold someone else's prayer for each week.

It's a guarantee that those rocks by the time we roll around to Easter will be transformed. Guaranteed.

Is this a shameless way to get you to come to church during Lent? No doubt! But even more so, this is a simple and beautiful way to see how prayer and community expand our hearts. I hope you'll join in on this community practice during Lent.

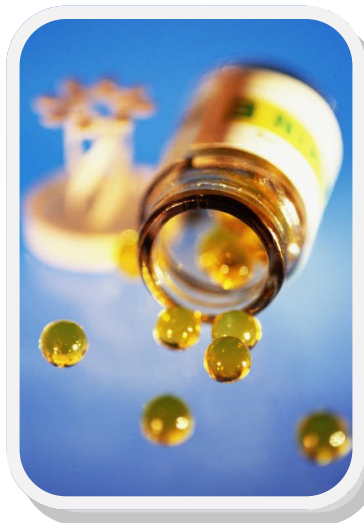

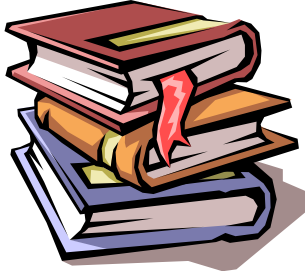

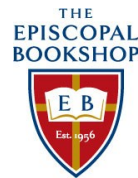
